Progress Report of the RSPG Working Group on the "European Electronic Communications Code"

Progress Report of the RSPG Working Group on "EECC"

The RSPG WG launched its activities with a kick-off meeting on 9 May (Budapest - Hungary). This meeting has been attended by 9 Member States representatives and the European Commission. An ad-hoc mailing list is in place and interested Member States are invited to contact the co-rapporteurs to subscribe and to join it.

1. Preliminary analysis: Impact on the role of RSPG

The work has been launched on the basis of the Work Item adopted by the last RSPG and published in February 2018 and of the current policy agreement at "trilogue" level on the spectrum part of the future EECC.

The first preliminary analysis reviewed the various relevant articles in relation with RSPG activities and revealed that

- Some current tasks will remain unchanged
- Several current activities/tasks will be consolidated and formalized by the EECC
- Several new tasks/activities are going to be assigned to RSPG beyond its current framework
- The EECC will provide a "tool box" to implement various objectives of the EECC dealing with spectrum issues

It has been noted that the current description of the 'peer review" in the EECC needs to be further analysed in order to assess the legal and practical impacts on the current voluntary "peer review" already in place within RSPG.

Concerning the "good offices", the current process is expected to be formalized by the EECC. Any addition to the current process needs to be further analysed.

In view of BEREC's recognised competence on market regulation and competition issues, the EECC will request RSPG to cooperate with BEREC to this end. This will be taken into consideration in the analysis of relevant articles in order to assess areas of common interests with BEREC and cooperation needs. The WG notes that various forms of cooperation have been implemented in the past: common workshops, common deliverables.

The WG will monitor the final process of the EECC negotiation, in particular the debate on legal basis establishing RSPG, and intends to base its future activity on the final policy agreement on the overall EECC.

2. RSPG rules of procedure

The WG noted that the current RSPG rules of procedure (RoP)¹ have been adopted in 2012 further to the last update of the EC Decision establishing the RSPG².

The WG will assess the need to update the RoP further to the analysis on the impact to RSPG.

3. RSPP

The WG did not start yet the analysis of the impact of the EECC on the RSPP published in 2013. It has nevertheless been noted that this Council and European Parliament Decision is without prejudice to Union law and to measures taken at national level, in compliance with Union law.

4. Next Steps

The next meetings will take place on the 18/06/18 (Brussels – B), 30/08/18 (Maisons Alfort – F), 13/09/18 (Bonn-GER) (to be confirmed), 6/11/18 (Budapest – H).

Rationale	The European Commission proposed in 2016 an overhaul of the regulatory framework, to be called the European Electronic Communications Code (EECC). Among the proposals were new rules on spectrum co-ordination, authorisation regimes and assignments. New roles for the RSPG were also proposed. EECC is under negotiation with Council and EP before adoption.			
Scope				
Planned deliverables and timing	The results of the working group shall be presented to the RSPG (in the form of reports and/or opinions) for consideration and possible adoption. The nature of this work item will depend on the outcome of the current legislative negotiations under final phase, and specific deliverables will be proposed in response to developments in those negotiations. The draft analysis of EECC spectrum related issues and proposed updates on RoP will be ready RSPG October meeting. If needed, the working group will suggest also by October amendments of the EC Decision establishing RSPG.			

Analytical approach	This Work item reacts to EECC spectrum related issues in close connection with RSPG and RSPP. This Work item ensures that proper explanations are provided to Policy makers when appropriate. This work item took into account relevant RSPG deliverables developed during the last years.
